World Vision Caregiver Kits

PURPOSE

equip volunteers who are caring for those living with AIDS

Please purchase all of the items needed to complete a kit:

3 bars of antibacterial soap
Hands are major transmitters of infection. Soap helps prevent caregivers from spreading infections between patients.

1 container of petroleum jelly (13 oz.) The skin of chronically ill patients is often dry and prone to cracking, increasing their chances of infection. Petroleum jelly keeps skin moisturized and protected.

1 tube of antifungal cream* (Clotrimazole, 1 or 2 oz.) The most common infections among patients are fungal infections of the skin. The antifungal cream in this kit offers easy access to treatment.

1 bag of cotton balls (200-count)
Cotton balls are used to clean patients' mouths and any sores.

1 box of disposable latex gloves (100-count) Latex gloves prevent the spread of infection within a patient's home and between a caregiver's patients.

4 colored washcloths Even the most basic items are hard to come by in poverty-stricken areas. These washcloths will be used to bathe and dry patients.

2 notebooks (80- to 100-sheet) and 10 pens Caregivers take notes on each patient's health and keep them on file.

1 flashlight with batteries
Patients often need assistance at night, and most live in areas with no electricity.

1 storage container (12-qt. plastic sweater box with lid)* This container will provide dry storage and easy transportation of all the kit items.

* Sufficient quantities of antifungal cream, aspirin, Imodium, and storage containers have been donated to this project.

Each kit is completed with:

A handwritten note to encourage the caregiver Your words have the power to offer hope and encouragement to a caregiver! Your prayers and support will give them strength in the battle to save lives and offer comfort to the sick. You will receive the appropriate number of blank prayer cards from your event coordinator.
